



HIV reinfection or superinfection is a consequence of unprotected sexual encounters between two people living with HIV. Compelling evidence has surfaced in human case studies that have confirmed that HIV reinfection can occur and can be very problematic for HIV infected people. There are several strains of HIV, and in addition, when exposed to medications HIV changes or mutates over time. Having unprotected sex with another person that has HIV can create a reinfection that combines both strands of HIV that is then potentially immune to medication. Over time, this new strain will flourish rendering a once successful treatment useless, and your immune system pays the price.
