



The likelihood that HIV is transmitted from an HIV-positive person to an HIV-negative person depends on the type of contact involved. HIV is most easily transmitted by unprotected anal sex, sharing injecting equipment, and from mother to baby.

Oral sex has a lower risk than these practices, but it doesn't rule the possibility of contracting HIV out. It's also worth remembering that other sexually transmitted infections, such as syphilis, herpes and gonorrhoea, can be quite easily transmitted through oral sex.

The safest way to perform oral sex is to wear flavoured condoms. However if you are not going to use protection, oral sex can be made less risky by ; not allowing someone to cum in your mouth, not performing oral sex on someone who has sores/cuts on their penis, not performing oral sex when you have cuts/sores/ulcers in your mouth.
