

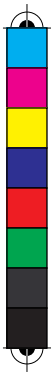




## Gonorrhoea is changing.

New strains of Gonorrhoea are becoming drug resistant. This means that people with Gonorrhoea are becoming harder to treat effectively.

Gonorrhoea can affect the penis, bum and throat. Symptoms of Gonorrhoea in the penis can be; pain or irritation when urinating and a discharge from the penis. Gonorrhoea in the bum and throat can go unnoticed and present no symptoms.

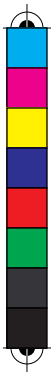




## Protect yourself and others!
